We welcomed everybody back to school this week with a special welcome for international students from Japan and Germany. The welcome was warm even if the weather wasn't! Winter has played its part in increasing levels of staff illness and our need to respond with the rostering home of Year 10 students today. Plans for school over the next week depend on our staff numbers and you can rely on us to be doing our best to remain open with business as usual as much as we can in the coming days. We aim to keep everyone informed in advance and to continue to support learning through digital platforms where necessary.

A big thank you to the parents supporting students with mask wearing this week. Senior students and staff have issued free masks daily and people have responded positively overall to this responsibility. We'll continue to follow the advice of the Ministries of Education and Health with the expectations around mask use for the next month or so.

Term three is an important time for a surge of effort for course completion and gaining qualifications in the senior school. Good attendance rates are at the heart of what is possible. The overall student attendance rate for the first week of term is an indication of how people value seeing each other and connecting after earlier experiences of lockdowns. It's also an indication of the focus in the senior school's preparation for the important assessments ahead. We know every minute counts.

Common Assessment Activities (CAA)

The CAA is part of the NCEA Change Package in which one of the externals will be sat in term three, with the final external to be sat during the NCEA exams in November. The CAA is only for the Level One pilot subjects. The results for the CAA will not be available until all external results are released in January of 2023. The student must bring their own Chrome book or laptop to sit the exam digitally.

Please note that the following Level One subjects have their Common Assessment Activity on these days and times:

SPS100 - Tuesday 9th Aug 9:30 - 11:30 COM100 - Wednesday 10th Aug 9:30 - 11:30 HIS100 - Thursday 18th Aug 9:30 - 11:30

As this is a normal school day, those Year 11s participating in the CAAs are expected to be in school uniform. Students will be called for during their period one class and are expected to go back to their normal timetable class when the CAA is finished.
