It is fantastic to get back into the normal swing of things with the highpoint of Polyfestival today.

NZQA Announcement

Today a package of changes for NCEA and University Entrance recognising the impact of COVID-19 on senior students has been announced. The following changes have been made for 2022:

Level 1 Students - Students will receive 1 Learning Recognition Credit for every five earned through assessment. Level 1 students can receive up to 10 Learning Recognition Credits.

Level 2 and 3 Students - Students will receive 1 Learning Recognition Credit for every five earned through assessment. Level 1 students can receive up to 8 Learning Recognition Credits

Certificate Endorsement - Students will need to earn 46 credits at Merit or Excellence level, instead of the usual 50.

University Entrance - University Entrance requirement to achieve at least 14 credits in each of 3 approved subjects has also been adjusted, to 14 credits in each of 2 approved subjects and 12 credits in a third approved subject.

The Ministry of Education is considering additional support for students to do catch-up learning so they can complete their qualifications before leaving school. Where that learning extends into 2023, NZQA will facilitate students' being awarded their qualification earlier in the year. This means students who need additional credits can return to school for the time required to achieve those credits; and will then be awarded their qualification.

Porirua Primary School Leadership Awards

On Monday 8th August our Student Leadership Team represented our College with pride at the Porirua Primary School Leadership Awards. This event, hosted by the Rotary Clubs of Porirua and the Porirua City Council saw students from across the city recognised for their outstanding work in leadership in our primary schools. Hosted at Elim Church, the event was headlined by an address from the Children's Commissioner, Judge Frances Eivers.

Our team of Fa'amalele Tovio, Samuel Lee, Alycia Capes-Parr and Leo Enoka, pictured here with Mayor Anita Baker, have been excellent representatives of Aotea College throughout the year and this event was no exception. We thank them for their ongoing work.
