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Kia ora koutou

The Ministry of Health modelling in July shows that numbers of severe respiratory illness cases, including both COVID-19 and flu, are well down. Your efforts will have certainly contributed to this outcome. Mask wearing when indoors continues to play an important role in minimising transmission of COVID-19 and winter illnesses, coupled with all the other layers of protection.

This information is in line with our current experience here at school.Thank you for your patience and forbearance as we kept the school open using the rostering home measure to allow this over the last couple of weeks.

Returning to school following illness

The Ministry of Health guidance for returning to schools following vomiting or diarrhoea has not changed. If a child is free of those symptoms for 48 hours, they can attend school again. Advice for whānau has been updated to reflect the following points:

- If a child has been unwell with a respiratory illness other than COVID-19, they can return to school 24 hours after they have significantly improved and are behaving/eating normally.
- Following vomiting or diarrhoea, a child should be symptom free for 48 hours before they can return.
- If they still have a runny nose or dry cough without any other symptoms such as a fever, vomiting or diarrhoea, then they are unlikely to be infectious and can be considered well enough to attend school.
- In general, a doctor's certificate or clearance should not have to be provided for a child to go back to school after being unwell.

Teacher only Accord Day

The school will be closed to students on Friday 26th August for a Ministry Accord Day for teachers. During this day teachers will be focusing on the NCEA change package. Aotea College is presently piloting nine new NCEA subjects across the Technology, Science, Social Science and Arts faculties.

During the teacher only day teachers from the pilot subjects will share their learning so far with the whole staff. They will also have an opportunity to explore the new Literacy and Numeracy corequisite for NCEA Level 1 which will come into effect next year. Actea College is looking at becoming a full pilot school for all NCEA Level 1 subjects in 2023, this day is a vital opportunity in making certain all teachers have the opportunity to fully understand the changes and make plans for 2023.

Reader / Writers needed

These students have learning differences such as dyslexia and qualify for special assessment conditions. The tasks may involve reading the exam questions to students and recording answers. Why host?

Hosting a student is an enriching experience for both yourselves and the student. You'll experience a true cultural exchange, sharing knowledge of your culture whilst learning about the many different cultures represented by our students. Often host families build lasting relationships with their students

What is expected from host families?

- Involve their student in their life, spend time talking with their students to give them confidence speaking in English and treat them as a member of the family.
- Be caring and understanding, patient but able to set boundaries
- Show their students how to get to and from school (e.g., where the bus stop is, how to access the bus schedule, how to walk to school).
- Provide three meals a day and snacks (including a packed lunch during the school week).
- Provide a furnished bedroom
- Provide bed linen (sheets, pillow, and blankets) and towels
- Provide wifi

What we provide

Aotea College has a well-resourced International Department, with a Homestay Coordinator who is able to provide you with advice and support.

Homestay families are paid a weekly fee of \$300.


