I am pleased to say we are weathering the deluges of rain, quite well. For those of you with long memories you'll know this wouldn't have been the case in our old school buildings. Every day of winter I've appreciated the warm dry place we work in.

I also really appreciate the work of the Aotea College Association who put funds together from their fundraising efforts to support students experiencing financial hardship particularly in important co curricular experiences - in the Arts, Music Sports and outdoor education trips. These funds make a real difference to students continuing with music tuition, participating in sports that are often expensive and trips into the wilderness of rivers, bushland and mountains.

Although we have much less staff Covid illness than we had, we still have winter illness and injuries creating pressure points of staff absence combined with low reliever numbers. Next week the relief pool at our school and across the region is stretched thin to cover Winter Tournament week. This requires advance planning and an agile response to keep the school open and operating normally.

This newsletter is advance notice of the intention to **roster home Year 11 next Friday the 2nd September**. Our Year 11s have done a sterling job of soldiering through their first digital external examinations, the Common Assessment Activities (CAAs) over the last 2-3 weeks. Many others are involved in Winter Tournament week. Ahead of them, Year 11s have their first experience of the Mathematics Common Assessment Test (MCAT) and Derived grade exams. Year 11s have not yet been rostered home and all of the above reasons have led us to this decision.

The Maths faculty is ready to run a workshop for the Year 10 and 11 MCAT students on Friday 2nd September to support these students with extra time for MCAT preparation. The MCAT workshop will run from 8:50-11:30am in KR08. Those Year 11 students not involved in the MCAT will be involved in learning from home and can access learning via their Google Classrooms and Education Perfect.

## Aotea College Year 9-12 course selection day 2021

Aotea College course selection day will be held on **Friday 9th September, 2022**. We ask parents to make a suitable appointment time via the website for their child to make their subject selections for 2023. The log on details for the online Year 9-12 course selection day booking system will be emailed to parents on Wednesday 31st August and will be open for booking from Thursday 1st September and will close on Wednesday 7th September at 4pm.

We will not have any scheduled classes on this day to enable the hui ako teachers to meet with parents and students. Year 13 students are not required to attend.

We will be holding interviews both onsite at school and online to enable as many parents to attend the course selection day as possible. When making your booking please comment whether you will be attending inperson or online. Hui Ako teachers will send out a meeting link to parents who indicate they wish to meet online on Thursday 8th September.

Course descriptions are available through the Pathways link on the school website for all levels. Please encourage your student to look through these before the meeting. You can also log in to the parent portal to obtain the most recent assessment results.

Subject selections will be completed through the Whānau Portal this year. Instruction on how to do this will be sent to all families and Hui Ako teachers will be able to help with this process. Aotea College is excited to be welcoming International Students back! With the return of International Students, we are now looking to expand our pool of homestay families, for both short term and long term hosting.

#### Why host?

Hosting a student is an enriching experience for both yourselves and the student. You'll experience a true cultural exchange, sharing knowledge of your culture whilst learning about the many different cultures represented by our students. Often host families build lasting relationships with their students

#### What is expected from host families?

- Involve their student in their life, spend time talking with their students to give them confidence speaking in English and treat them as a member of the family.
- Be caring and understanding, patient but able to set boundaries
- Show their students how to get to and from school (e.g., where the bus stop is, how to access the bus schedule, how to walk to school).
- Provide three meals a day and snacks (including a packed lunch during the school week).
- Provide a furnished bedroom
- Provide bed linen (sheets, pillow, and blankets) and towels
- Provide wifi

#### What we provide

Aotea College has a well-resourced International Department, with a Homestay Coordinator who is able to provide you with advice and support.

Homestay families are paid a weekly fee of \$300.
